On June 26, 1934, the U.S. Congress passed a law regulating the use of certain firearms in accordance with Firearms Act (NFA). This law classified certain firearms as weapons that must be controlled to promote public safety. Much of the legislation was a response to gangster days in the era, where criminals with Thompson machine guns would wreak havoc on unfortunate citizens. Since fully automatic weapons, short-range weapons and silencers posed the most vivid threats, Congress limited their ability to be owned by citizens, even those who had never committed a crime in their lives. Living foundations are legal arrangements in which a person, known as the beneficiary, can own the property of another person, a union representative, on their behalf. Living foundations act in the same way as will by transferring property in a way that is legally binding and undeniable. I'm one of them, Dodd said. I'm sensitive to loud noise. I can't help myself. I flinch every time because of noise. For children and first-time users, it's good if you can reduce that noise. It also provides better sniper work. The third reason for lifting the ban was use in wildlife management, such as the control of feral pigs or harvesting of deer. Sometimes scares the high report making into the next county, Dodd said. So if you can suppress that noise, you might be able to take out three or four pigs as opposed to one. And they may not be so afraid to get into a mat. Dodd said WFF has actually used suppressors in the past for deer control programs near urban areas. People need to understand that this is not James Bond-type silencers, he said. We have exploited them in nuisance deer control. They're kinder to the ears, but not quite quiet. Russ Sockwell, a gunsmith at Mark's Outdoors in Birmingham, said he also doesn't expect to see a rush of people trying to get suppressors. Although Mark's Outdoors doesn't sell them, Sockwell comes out of the barrel to accept suppressors. I haven't had any more requests for a barrel, than normal, Sockwell said. A suppressor should not affect the accuracy of the because the suppressor is lined up with the drilling of firearms and the crown of the barrel is not affected. In theory, it should not change the impact. In real life, it's probably going to change the point of impact, at least a little. The biggest problem I think people are going to encounter is, for the oppressor to work properly, you have to shoot subsonic ammunition. Most people don't. You don't get the boom, but you get the high crack. With subsonic ammunition, your range will be reduced enormously. I just don't see a lot of people getting them. I think the biggest thing that's going to stop a lot of people is the acquisition of the stamp. Joe Songer, photographer/videographer at Alabama Media Group/The Birmingham News, has been through the process of buying the suppressor stamp, and he agrees that it's a demanding process. Songer said the first step in the process is to find a dealer with a Class 3 firearms license from the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives (ATF). A lot of places just won't do that, Songer said. It requires a different level of experience; I know retailers who just don't want to go through the problem. People need to know that suppressors are highly regulated. The ATF is getting involved. You need to get an FBI background check. You need to get county and federal officials to sign your application. You need to have a sheriff or police chief sign it. You have to go in and get fingerprinted. You need to get a passport-type photo. All this is sent to the ATF. The thing is, you have to pay for all this in advance about six months before. Songer went through the process of getting a suppressor for his .22 Long Rifle firearm. I've always wanted one, but it's an obligation, he said. I got one for my 0.22s. When I got mine, ammunition was plentiful and not expensive. I wanted to be introduced to it and I wanted one that I would use quite a lot. Songer experimented with his suppressed .22s and found that ammunition is a major component of the amount of noise suppressed. The speed of the round and the barrel it comes out of makes a big difference, Songer said. A rifle barrel is going to have a higher speed than a shorter gun barrel with the same round. On my guns, I have good luck with rounds of 350 feet per second. When it gets up to around 1,100, I start to get that crack from the bullet going supersonic. People who hunt, most of these rounds are supersonic. If someone takes a hunting rifle and puts a suppressor on and the bullet travels at 7,700 feet per second, it won't be quiet. It gets quieter, but you get the crack when the bullet breaks the sound barrier. It's going to happen pretty fast. The thing is, the sound suppression comes from the muzzle, so it's getting harder to tell where it's coming from. Songer agrees with the view that there are not going to be many hunters who problems obtaining a suppressor. There's going to be some because there's a cool factor to it, he said. But when you apply for a suppressor you open yourself up to a whole lot of scrutiny. And another thing is that the stamp must be with the oppressor at all times. I can let you shoot it, but I have to be with you and have the stamp with me. Dodd said that if there is anything questionable in the applicant's background, that person will be flagged and the application process stopped. Even if you get the permission, you're going to be in their files, so to speak. Dodd said. Dodd continued: Someone said to us, 'Oh, the night hunters are going to go crazy.' It's the same argument we heard about crossbows. It wasn't really realized with crossbows. We've actually made night-hunting arrests of people with crossbows. We've been able to maneuver around the silent weapon, so to speak. I don't expect any change with oppressors. I would be surprised if even five percent of hunters decide to get a suppressor stamp.
